

# St Teresa's RCP Prayer Progression



This detailed progression in prayer at **St. Teresa's RC Primary** reflects a clear and structured approach to developing the spiritual life of students at different stages of their education. Here are some key points and summaries for each stage:

## **Progression in Prayer Openings**

# 1. Reception - Year 2:

- Focus on simple, loving language addressing God with titles like "Loving Father," "Holy God," and "Kind Lord."
- Introduction of more descriptive attributes in Year 2 (e.g., "Compassionate," "Understanding," "Everlasting").

#### 2. Lower KS2:

- Builds on KS1 vocabulary, adding themes of "Justice," "Mercy,"
  "Creation," and more.
- Encourages personalisation (e.g., "God of all Light").

# 3. Upper KS2:

- Expands to match themes of prayers to context, e.g., "God of all Justice and Peace."
- o Introduces a Trinitarian ending by Year 6.

# Types of Prayer Writing

# 1. Reception - Year 1:

- Focus on personal and family-centered prayers.
- Simple, repetitive, and scaffolded formats.

# 2. Year 2:

o Expands to include an awareness of the wider world.

# 3. **LKS2**:

 Introduction of Psalm Prayers (collaborative prayer-writing based on scripture). Simple Prayers of the Faithful and response prayers.

#### 4. UKS2:

- Greater independence in writing prayers.
- Includes expanded and more specific Prayers of the Faithful.
- Introduction of "You-Who-Do-Through" prayers with a Trinitarian ending.

# **Daily Prayers**

Children are introduced to and memorize daily prayers progressively:

- Reception: Morning Offering, Grace Before/After Meals, Home Time Prayer, Sign of the Cross.
- KS1: Introduction of foundational prayers like "Our Father" and "Hail Mary."
- KS2: Gradual inclusion of more formal prayers such as "Glory Be," "Eternal Rest," "Act of Contrition," and the Angelus by Year 6.

# Silent Prayer and Meditation

### 1. Reception and KS1:

- Simple prompts for reflective silent prayer.
- Contemplation inspired by scripture, music, or art.

#### 2. KS2:

- Use of Lectio Divina: A four-step process (Lectio Read, Meditatio -Reflect, Oratio - Respond, Contemplatio - Rest).
- o Daily Examen: Reflection on personal actions and spiritual growth.

# **Group and Liturgical Prayers**

- Rosary Decade: Led by the GIFT Team in May and October.
- Angelus: Introduced in Year 6 for daily midday prayer.
- **Communal Practices:** Responses in group prayers learned progressively to build community participation.

This structure nurtures children's spiritual development, aligning with their intellectual, emotional, and social growth. It's a comprehensive blend of personal reflection, community prayer, and scriptural engagement tailored to different age groups.
